

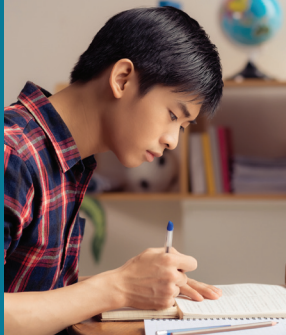
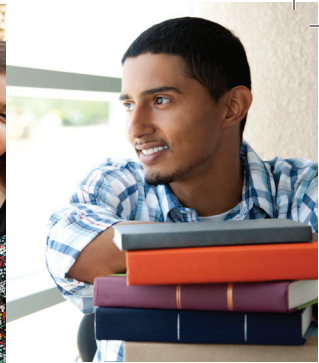

LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR


After almost 15 years at Pegasus, I am stepping down as executive director. Pegasus' Board has initiated the search for my replacement, and I expect to be moving on sometime this summer or early fall. Without a doubt, I can say that founding Pegasus and acting as executive director has been the most rewarding experience of my life.

I owe an incredible debt of gratitude to my co-founder, Tara Ford, for her brilliance, dedication, and friendship. I am also grateful to all of the amazing individuals who have served on our Board over the years – I wish I could name them all here. I leave Pegasus with great confidence in our staff; they hold the vision and values of Pegasus, and they will give the new Executive Director the time he or she needs to become a leader who can drive Pegasus' future work.

One of the things that has given me tremendous satisfaction as executive director of Pegasus is the generosity of all the people who have supported us

over the years. It is as though there had been a dark, blank space in the community, and when Pegasus filled that space, the community of people who care most about children and youth breathed a sigh of relief. In 2016, Pegasus significantly expanded its representation of children and youth in foster care when it entered into a contract to represent children and youth in 40% of the cases filed in the 2nd Judicial District, the largest judicial district in the state.

We put together a team of staff and contract attorneys, and managing attorneys with over thirty years of experience in the child welfare system.

During the past year, Pegasus attorneys have identified several areas where the rights of foster children are not receiving the attention and respect they deserve. For example, too often children with developmental disabilities are identified as having a mental health problem without consideration of their developmental disability. Consequently, our

clients sometimes are placed in services that are inappropriate. When the child does not respond to the services, he or she is labeled as seriously troubled, leading to placements with higher and higher levels of restriction.

Pegasus is working hard to ensure that children in foster care who have a developmental disability receive appropriate services, and that they have the opportunity to live in the least restrictive placement appropriate for their needs.

SPOTLIGHT ON EARLY INTERVENTION

Currently, New Mexico lacks a universally accepted screening tool for pediatricians and other primary care providers to use to identify risk for mental health and developmental delays in young children. Linking families to needed services early helps reduce behavioral and emotional problems (depression, anxiety, aggression), suicide rates, substance use, involvement with juvenile justice, and improved school attendance and grades. Screening also improves lives for families and extended families through decreased caregiver strain, increased capacity to handle the child's challenging behavior, and increased ability to work and earn money. The Alliance for Early Success is supporting Pegasus' work to identify and promote screening tools that capture developmental progress and the need for early intervention services.

When I explain the type of work that I do, people often react with sadness or preoccupation about my ability to deal with issues of abuse and neglect of children. It is true that my work involves tough subjects and very emotional situations involving a very vulnerable population:

substance abuse, domestic violence, homelessness and poverty are reoccurring factors leading to children ending up in foster care or with relatives seeking guardianship. There are times that I feel discouraged and sad. But there are joyous moments too, like when a grandmother hugs me with happiness and relief upon obtaining guardianship

of her grandchild or when a child runs up to me during a home visit. Establishing trust with my clients is a priority for me and I work very hard at it. Small gestures of trust and kindness such as this one makes me love my job. I also get to hold and cuddle babies – and who is not going to love that!

Larry Kronen, director of the Kinship Guardianship Program, is leaving Pegasus after more than ten years of service. Larry will be opening a private practice through which he will continue his work protecting the health, welfare and rights of New Mexicans.

Larry is known throughout New Mexico as the leading expert on the Kinship Guardianship Act. He has helped hundreds of grandparents and other caregivers become legal guardians of children whose parents cannot raise them due to substance abuse, mental illness and incarceration. Larry's many former clients are unstinting in their praise and gratitude for Larry's sensitive and compassionate work. Larry is known not just for his zealous representation of his clients, but

for his compassion for the opposing parties who are usually unrepresented and struggling to overcome their own histories of abuse, neglect, substance abuse, and mental illness. We will miss Larry and we wish him well in his new endeavors.



Larry received the 2016 2nd Judicial District Pro Bono Committee's **Pro Bono Attorney of the Year** award for his years of work on the committee and his commitment to providing legal services to low income people.



Pegasus recognizes the importance of serving its clients in a comprehensive and holistic manner, beyond the legal realm. To address that need, Pegasus provides internships to students in social work programs. Interns receive supervision from Ella Brown, the staff social worker, to develop practice that promotes advocacy for clients along the spectrum from micro to macro work. Interns accompany clients to court, do foster home visits, provide thoughtful referrals, research relevant support systems, do outreach to community agency partners, and participate in statewide efforts to create legislative changes that better the lives of children in New Mexico. Interns work in partnership with attorneys across all Pegasus programs, rounding out the services provided while gaining a wide range of experience that informs their future practice.
